## British Columbia Facts<sup>1</sup>



### Work-related death claims for 2021

There were 161 work-related deaths in 2021. Of those:

- 2 who died were young workers
- 99 workers died as a result of occupational disease, with 53 as a result of asbestos exposure
- 13 workers died as a result of exposure to COVID-19 in the workplace

The workers who died included 149 males and 12 females.

### In 2021:

- There were a total of 97,591 short-term disability, long-term disability, and health-care only claims.
- Workplace injury and illness resulted in about 3.6 million lost days of work.
- More than 2,700 claims were reported each week and more than 130 long-term disability claimants received a first payment each week.
- Almost 3 work-related death claims were accepted each week.

- 4 Single-incident work-related death claims are primarily coded based on incident location.
